CONSTRUCTION & BUILDING UPDATE!:

Greetings Brothers and Friends of Accacia Lodge No 51! 2020 despite its huge disappointments was a largely fruitful year for Accacia 51 in so much as the construction and renovation project that had been talked about for many years began in force.

This project would not have been possible without the generous monetary gift from the estate of WB Gordon Eddy and continued donations from his brother WB Bob Eddy. Continued Gratitude to the Eddy family for their help to our humble Lodge!

During the construction project, some costs did go beyond our budget. Other brothers working on the project stepped up and covered those expenses. We thanked those brothers as those costs were sizable. We also want to express gratitude to all who labored on this project and who put labor into it. Thank you all!



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE CONTINUED:

This was just the first phase in a series of planned updates to the Lodge. We still need to complete our trim work and finish carpentry of the windows inside the Lodge room.

The Lodge room itself needs some updating. We will replace the carpet and add a center floor feature of a Mosiac black and white oblong checkered square.

- We currently have the material to finish the window trim work.
- The carpet costs and installation will be around \$4325 (\$1325 for carpet and \$3000 for installation).

Next, the City of Cottage Grove has said we must have a ramp on our deck and front entrance. This was in the original plans but we had to adjust for the size of the deck and cost. This addition will be added this coming summer.

• The cost of the ramp will be around \$900

The next project on the list is the renovation of the upstairs kitchen. This project has already begun with the update in lighting. However, we plan on swapping all new windows to match the new ones in the Lodge. We also plan to completely resheetrock the walls and ceiling and paint the room. We then will tile the floor and the room will gleam!

Tile has already been purchased for this project. We will need eight windows, twenty sheets of rock and trim, etc.

• The cost of this project is estimated at \$1830 in total.

We then move downstairs to the basement windows and window well replacement. Eight windows will need replacement and we are adding in window wells with drainage material.

• The estimated cost for this part of the project is around \$1800 to \$2000.

The last major thing for 2021 and yes I know this is a heavy load but the Lodge really needs this and more, is a restroom renovation. We want to keep two restrooms because it is useful for our pancake breakfasts, dinners, and other fundraisers we do. Also, the Eastern Star likes to have a separate facility. We plan to demo the whole existing restrooms and salvage our toilets, urinal, etc. We will rebuild larger restrooms with new cabinets, pedestal sinks, new sinks, new mirrors, and new lights. So we will need wallboard, lumber, light fixtures, mirrors, cabinets, pedestals, etc.

Cost estimate: \$1200

Our estimated building costs for the 2021 projects come in at \$9055. Anything our Brothers can do to help us with this ongoing project would be most appreciated.

We are planning on fundraising for the construction and building fund, however, we also are asking our brethren for assistance in this undertaken. Accacia 51 is alive and growing! We just need to care for our building so we always have a place for our Lodge.




